FLOOD UPDATE

Flood damage estimates for Kenosha County are as follows:

- \$11,975,000 in estimated Private Sector Damages based upon 1, 202 Homes/Businesses that were flooded;
- \$847,934 in estimated Public Sector Damages broken down as follows:
 - \$21,900 in Debris Clearance
 - \$57,000 in Protective Measures
 - \$264,559 in Road Systems
 - \$110,000 in Water Control Facilities
 - \$18,000 in Public Buildings and Related Equipment
 - \$285,475 in Public Utility Systems
 - \$91,000 in Other Damages

Residents that have not yet contacted Kenosha County Emergency Management with storm or flood damages are asked to either E-mail them EMDisaster@co.kenosha.wi.us or call their Damage Hotline at 262-605-7926 or 262-605-7928 to report their flood/storm damages. Information needed is: Name, address, phone number, Municipality, whether they are insured, how much water/sewage they had and whether it was on the first floor or in the basement.

Residents with questions regarding flood cleanup, well water testing or any health hazard questions can contact the Kenosha County Division of Public Health's Hotline at 262-605-6700.

Elderly or disabled needing assistance can call Kenosha County Aging & Disability Services at 262-605-6646. Callers will be sent to Information & Assistance staff who can talk with them about their needs. Currently they do not have a list of volunteers that can assist with the cleanup, but they maintain a list of resources.

Residents with contaminated wells from floodwaters should have their wells tested before resuming use of their water. Floodwaters can contain bacteria and waste contaminants that threaten water supplies. Kenosha County Division of Health is making free well test kits

available to residents whose wells have been contaminated by flood waters. The free well test kits are available from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. at the following locations:
