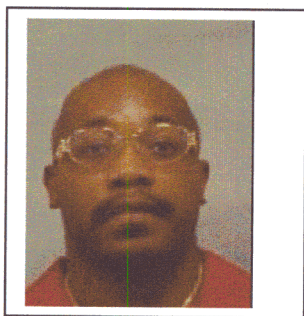

The Kenosha County Sheriff's Department, in cooperation with the Sex Offender Notification Committee, is releasing the following information pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 301.46(2m). This statute now allows law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offender's release when; in the discretion of this committee, the release of the information will enhance public safety, awareness and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense. Further, his criminal history places him in a classification level which reflects the *potential* to re-offend.

This offender is NOT wanted by the Sheriff's Department at this time. This notification is not intended to alarm the community; but rather it is our belief that an informed community is a safer community.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities after release from incarceration. With the enactment of Statute 301.46(2m) in 1997, law enforcement is now allowed to share this information with the community. Abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate, or harass a registered sex offender will not be tolerated. Mr. Smothers held a piece of glass against the throat of an adult female acquaintance and sexually assaulted her. He also threatened to kill her if she screamed or told on him.

Mr. Smothers is being placed into the community on October 1, 2009 after having been released from prison in March 2009. He will be residing within a half mile radius of CTH MB and STH 50 and is on the short range electronic monitoring system. He is not employed at this time.

He is to have no unsupervised contact with minors, no taverns, bars or liquor stores. He is to have no contact with his victim and is not to consume alcohol or drugs. He must comply with standard sex offender rules, face to face contact with law enforcement is required, and must comply with all requirements and lifetime registrant of Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.
